The signs will be installed on sidewalks up at Marson Park. The signs will be installed this summer, likely in August. No action was taken.

Elias Anderson presented a proposal to install a vending machine outside City Hall in Marston Park. The vending machine would require a soda license and lease agreement from the City. Commissioners asked questions and made comments.
